A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

[Jesus said to his disciples] "Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me." Matthew 10:40.

Members at St. Matthew often talk about the warm atmosphere of the congregation. Perhaps someone reached out to them when they first visited, or the worship and ministries of the church invited them in. The process of welcoming is intentional and is rooted in our faith. In Matthew 10, Jesus equates welcoming another person with welcoming himself, as well as God who sent him. Clearly welcoming matters!

We are extending the St. Matthew welcome in several new ways on Sunday morning. The first is the new bulletin format, which allows for visitors to follow the service with ease. It also accommodates new wording to familiar prayers. New language can speak to new people and can foster a deeper understanding of our worship among new and longtime members alike.

Another way we have been building on the welcoming spirit of St. Matthew is in the variety of songs that Michelle, the choir, and our congregational musicians bring us each week. We are singing traditional hymnody, as well as spirituals and music from around the world. We hear piano and organ, guitar and drums, sax and viola. Not every style is equally loved by all people but singing another person's favorite songs is another great way to show welcome.

This summer we will try one more way to enlarge our welcome, and that is adding grape juice to the options at communion. We already offer gluten free wafers to anyone who asks; the pastor simply carries them in a separate napkin and distributes them at the same time as the bread. Similarly, to include people who cannot drink wine, we will offer a tray of small cups with white grape juice. The process will be: the pastor gives out the bread, the communion assistant offers a tray with red wine in the individual cups, and then finally the assisting minister offers a tray with white grape juice in the cups. Those who wish to drink from the common cup of wine may come forward as usual at the beginning of the singing of the Lamb of God.

God welcomes everyone—but through our words and actions, we demonstrate that we at St. Matthew are living out that welcome, accommodating the needs and preferences for many kinds of people who come to our church. It's about making a place for someone else. It's about making a place for Jesus.

I am grateful to be in the welcoming business with all of you. Blessings,


