## A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Fall has always been my favorite season. The temperature is not too hot and not too cold. The air smells crisp. It's perfect for hiking. Nature appears mature and full, with leaves revealing brilliant hues of orange, red, yellow, purple, and brown. It is a period of harvest both for crops and for the human mind to gather itself. It can be a time for us to embrace a holistic, natural spirituality, to enjoy the beauty of creation and observe the wisdom of the natural world. Watching birds fly south for the winter, squirrels collect acorns, and other animals prepare for hibernation helps us attune to the rhythms of the earth. It's also a delight to watch our beloved domestic animals play and explore the outdoors. There is something sacred about our pets and the pure love they give. There's something about having animals live with us that helps keep humans connected to nature in the midst of a lifestyle that so often keeps us away from nature. Animals teach us the simple joy of being.

St. Francis of Assisi is the patron saint of animals and ecology. He is known for renouncing all his father's wealth, living a life of voluntary poverty, and having a deep connection to the natural world. Birds would sometimes flock around him while he spoke and he referred to animals as his sisters and brothers, as well as to rivers, mountains, the sun, moon, and stars as siblings. **October 4th is St. Francis' Feast Day and we will celebrate with a Blessing of the Animals at St. Matthew. We will do this both virtually at 9:00 a.m. and in-person at 11:00 a.m.** We hope you bring your beloved pets to receive a blessing, and that you are open to them teaching you to embrace lovingness and playfulness and all the gifts they offer.

Later in October we celebrate the gift of music at outdoor worship with a performance of **Bach's Cantata 51 on October 11, and Reformation Sunday at both services on October 25th.** As you know this is a very important day for Lutherans! **Don't forget to wear red!** It is not merely a time to flex our Protestant muscles however, but should be a time of reflection on how the church has been reformed and continues to reform. As many have said "the church is always reforming!" We are especially aware of this in 2020, with services online and outdoors, and all the other ways our lives have changed this year.

So join us October 4th with your pets, October 11 for Bach, and October 25th wearing red. We look forward to all this season has in store!

## **REOPENING TASK FORCE UPDATE**

The Reopening Task Force successfully planned and implemented outdoor worship services on Sunday, beginning August 30. This 11:00 a.m. service is about 30 minutes long, with generously spaced seating spread throughout the back lawn of the church. Parishioners sign in at the contact tracing attendance sheet, and then are directed by an usher to their seat. Everyone wears a mask, with the exception of the clergy when they are speaking. We plan to celebrate communion at several of these services using pre-filled cups of grape juice and wafer packets which parishioners will pick up at the sign in table. We will remain outdoors as long as the weather holds; please visit the website for up-to-date information on outdoor worship cancellation or a planned move indoors.

The safety protocols that we are practicing at our outdoor worship services will continue as we move the service indoors, likely the first Sunday in November. **When we come inside to worship, we will require everyone to sign up online or by calling the office beforehand**, to accommodate physical distancing.

Worship on Zoom at 9:00 a.m. will remain our principal worship service throughout the pandemic, as it is a safe option for everyone.

Thank you to the ushers, altar guild, sound personnel, task force members, staff and leaders who are making in person worship possible in these unusual times!

## **COMMUNION OPTIONS DURING THIS TIME OF PANDEMIC**

During the summer, St Matthew members studied the theology and practice of Holy Communion in the Lutheran Church. We learned that the gathering of the people of God is an essential element in our understanding of the sacrament: the Body of Christ is the spiritual food that is shared in Communion, but it is also the people who gather, who are Christ's hands and feet in the world. Holy Communion is nourishment for our spiritual lives as well as the forgiveness of sins, and it is clear the people of St Matthew have been missing this sacrament of sustenance and grace. **For this reason, we, your pastors, have decided to offer Holy Communion at in-person outdoor and indoor worship services as our safety protocols are put into place, and also at our Zoom worship services, beginning in October.**

It is a new thing to offer communion virtually. As pastors, we experience our community as truly gathering when we meet for worship on Zoom; the service is in real time, and we pray, sing and speak together. It is not the same as being together in person, and this is not something we plan to offer beyond the pandemic period. We feel, however, this is the best way to safely meet the spiritual need for communion for everyone during this time. We will also begin bringing the sacrament to homebound members, and arrange for a first communion for our sixth graders.

**The whole community will have the opportunity to commune on October 18, which we have designated as Communion Sunday for both the virtual and in-person services.** Those who choose to partake of communion on Zoom will need to assemble the elements from the pantry at home: grape juice or wine, bread or rice crackers. The pastors will lead the communion prayers via the zoom service, and people will commune themselves or the others in their homes. Those who come to outdoor worship will commune with pre-filled cups of grape juice and wafer packets which are picked up at the sign-in table. We encourage you to bring any questions you have to us, and look forward to communing with you!

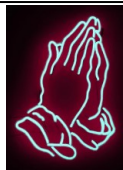


## **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

### **FINANCE UPDATE**

Thank you to all who continue to support the financial needs of our church and congregation, through honoring pledges, and other contributions and gifts during this time.

As you know, we were able to pay off our mortgage in June, thanks to the Capital Campaign receipts and a loan from Endowment. We pay down the Endowment loan principal with continued contributions to the Capital Campaign. The balance at the end of August was approximately \$38 thousand.

Our offering income continues to be ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis, thanks to some prepaid pledges. We will continue to need your faithfulness in giving to keep our budget balanced through year end.
